Rhizomatous perennial tussock grass inhabiting salt marshes and the edges of estuaries and other brackish or saltwater bodies.

A hardy plant that prefers a sunny position in saline soils. Can be slow to recover after disturbance.

flowering season

Most flowers will occur from November to March, but will commonly set some flowers year round.

flower colour

Dark brown to reddish-brown. Flowers occur in panicles at the same height or slightly above the foliage.

Dark green to golden brown sharp pointed leaves.

width

up to 2m
