### westringia glabra

An open shrub growing to 1m in height and width. Oval shaped dark green leaves in whorls of three or four. Blue-mauve to lilac coloured flowers occur from late winter through to summer

A hardy plant adaptable to most soils and preferring part shade.

Late Winter through Spring to Summer.

The flowers are a pale blue-mauve in colour with dark red spots in the throats.

The dark green leaves are oval to lance shaped and are arranged in whorls of three or four around the stem.
