westringia 'Wynyabbie Gem'

A hybrid between *Westringia fruticosa* and *Westringia eremicola*. A hardy compact shrub with narrow grey-green to dark green leaves and small blue-mauve flowers arising from the leaf axils.

origin

Hybrid species.

cultural notes

Adapts to a wide range of climates and well drained soils.
Prefers full sun.

maintenance

Can be pruned after flowering to maintain shape.

tolerates

Tolerant of frost, drought, salt spray and low nutrient soils.

flowering season

Year round except in extreme heat or cold.

flower colour

Small blue-mauve flowers arising from the leaf axils.

foliage colour

Narrow grey-green to dark green leaves arranged in whorls of four around the stem.

A very tough plant useful in many difficult situations. Often used as a native hedge.
