Crassula helmsii

swamp stone crop

Spreading perennial that inhabits the edges of stationary or slow flowing water. Occasionally found floating in water. Spreads by rooting from the nodes.

cultural notes

Aquatic or semi aquatic, requires consistent water. Grow in full sun.

ecosystem type

wetland

maintenance

Can spread rapidly, should be cut back as necessary to prevent unwanted spreading.

tolerates

Inundation, frost, salt.

soil type and drainage

poor drainage

flowering season

Spring and Summer.

flower colour

Small white flowers, sometimes tinged with red, occurring in the upper leaf axils.

foliage colour

Foliage is made up of narrow succulent light green leaves, sometimes tinged with red.

height

up to 0.3m

water depth

wetland margins

plant spacing

10cm apart

recommended uses

Useful for suppressing weed at the edge of ponds and dams, frog habitat.
