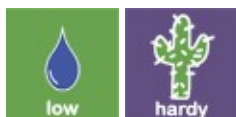

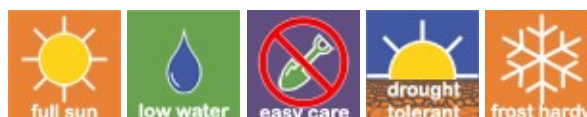

grevillea 'Poorinda Royal Mantle'

Thought to be a hybrid of Grevillea laurifolia and Grevillea willisii. A vigorous and adaptable groundcover spreading to 6m.

origin	Hybrid species.
cultural notes	A hardy and reliable plant that is tolerant of most soils. Prefers full sun and reasonable drainage.
maintenance	Can be pruned to maintain shape.
tolerates	Drought and frost tolerant. Adaptable to most Australian climates.

project type

erosion control
horticultural production

flowering season	Much of the year, at best in Winter and Spring.
flower colour	Red toothbrush shaped flowers.
foliage colour	The mature foliage is glossy green. This plant has inherited characteristics from both parents and leaves can be either entire or irregularly lobed. New foliage is a coppery red in colour.

soil type and drainage

light - sandy soils
medium - loamy soils
good drainage

width	up to 6m
height	up to 0.3m
plant spacing	100cm apart
recommended uses	The density, speed of growth and adaptability make this groundcover useful in a wide range of gardens.
