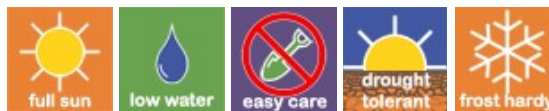

origin	Cultivar
cultural notes	A hardy plant accepting of most soils. Prefers full sun.
maintenance	Prune lightly if required.
tolerates	Frost and drought tolerant.
flowering season	Spring.
flower colour	Yellow to pale pink loosely clustered spider-like flowers.
foliage colour	Bright to dark green linear to ovate leaves.
width	up to 3m
height	up to 2m
plant spacing	80cm apart
recommended uses	A fast growing shrub suitable as an low informal hedge or feature plant. Bird attracting.
