# Grevillea x gaudichaudii

## grevillea 'Gaudi Chaudi'

A naturally occurring hybrid of Grevillea acanthifolia and Grevillea laurifolia. A vigorous groundcover spreading up to 5m. Attractive foliage and deep pink-red flowers appearing in Spring, Summer and Autumn.



**top ten**

bird attracting

**origin**

NSW- Blue Mountains.

**cultural notes**

A hardy, fast growing groundcover that will thrive in a sunny, well drained position. Thrips can be problematic to this species.

**maintenance**

Can be pruned to maintain shape.

**tolerates**

Tolerant of drought, frost and salt spray.

**flowering season**

Spring through to Autumn.

**flower colour**

Toothbrush shaped flowers are a vibrant pink-red in colour.

**foliage colour**

Leaves are up to 10cm long and multi-lobed, reminiscent of oak leaves. They are dark green and have a reddish tint in cold weather and on the new growth.

**width**

up to 5m

**height**

up to 0.1m

**plant spacing**

300cm apart

**recommended uses**

Useful for its fast growth and large coverage. Plant on banks and over retaining walls.
