origin	All states.
cultural notes	A hardy plant that prefers a sunny position in saline soils. Can be slow to recover after disturbance.
tolerates	salt tolerant.
flowering season	Most flowers will occur from November to March, but will commonly set some flowers year round.
flower colour	Dark brown to reddish-brown. Flowers occur in panicles at the same height or slightly above the foliage.
foliage colour	Dark green to golden brown sharp pointed leaves.
width	up to 2m
height	up to 1.5m
plant spacing	50cm apart
recommended uses	A good pioneer regeneration species. Useful for stabilising banks in salt areas.
