## westringia glabra

An open shrub growing to 1m in height and width. Oval shaped dark green leaves in whorls of three or four. Blue-mauve to lilac coloured flowers occur from late winter through to summer

<b>origin</b>	NSW, Vic.
<b>cultural notes</b>	A hardy plant adaptable to most soils and preferring part shade.
<b>maintenance</b>	Can be pruned to maintain shape.
<b>tolerates</b>	Frost and drought tolerant.
<b>flowering season</b>	Late Winter through Spring to Summer.
<b>flower colour</b>	The flowers are a pale blue-mauve in colour with dark red spoits in the throats.
<b>foliage colour</b>	The dark green leaves are oval to lance shaped and are arranged in whorls of three or four around the stem.
<b>width</b>	up to 1m
<b>height</b>	up to 1m
<b>plant spacing</b>	30cm apart
<b>recommended uses</b>	Attractive plant useful as a hedge or feature plant.
