



Brachychiton populneus

Kurrajong

This is a medium-sized evergreen tree with a rounded canopy. The leaves are large and bright green, and the bark is smooth and grey-brown. This tree produces lovely bell-shaped flowers that are white with a striped purple inner tube. This tree is known for its food uses within indigenous communities.

Origin	Eastern Australia.
Size	From 10-20 metres high, Up to 8 metres wide.
Cultural Notes	Full sun is preferred. This tree is low maintenance. Water in well after planting. Initial pruning can limit tree size.
Tolerates	Tolerates drought and some frost. Is very adaptable to poor soils.
Flowers / Flowering Season	Flowers are bell-shaped and with white colouring on the outer petal. On the inner flower tube, the petals are streaked with purple. This tree flowers in spring.
Foliage Colour or Type	Foliage is a lovely bright green in varying shapes, from single-pointed to 3-9 lobes.
Soil Type	Well-draining, moist soil is preferred. Most soil types and pH levels are tolerated.
Suited to	This tree is very often used in streetscapes through Australia and has a variety of uses within indigenous communities, including food.
