Cedrus deodara Himalyan Cedar

A large evergreen conifer tree, growing up to 30 metres in a conical shape. Known for its sharp spiked foliage that is coloured a subtle silver-green.

Origin	The Himalayas.
Size	Up to 30 metres high, Up to 6 metres wide.
Cultural Notes	Full sun is best, though this cedar can withstand partial shade. It prefers milder climates with slight humidity. Mulching in the summer can help keep the tree's roots cool. No pruning is required for this tree.
Tolerates	Wind tolerant and frost hardy. After establishment, this tree can become somewhat drought resistant.
Flowers / Flowering Season	A monoecious species, meaning they produce both male and female flowers or cones on the same tree. Cones are produced in spring and summer.
Foliage Colour or Type	Long spikes with a silver-green tinge droop down from the branch.
Soil Type	Well-draining loam soil with an acidic pH is preferred.
Suited to	Parklands or larger gardens are ideal given the size of the tree.
