



Eucalyptus pauciflora

Snow Gum, White Sallee (or Sally)

A small to medium-sized tree growing to 30m in lowland areas. This tree has an oval-shaped canopy. The alpine variety, E.p. niphophila, only reaches 15m. The bark is smooth and mottled, white, grey or yellow in colour. White flowers in spring and summer.

Origin	NSW, ACT, Vic, Tas, Qld.
Size	Up to 30 metres high, Up to 20 metres wide.
Cultural Notes	Prefers a sunny position. In cold areas, the bark develops patches of orange, red, yellow and olive green. Bee attractant.
Tolerates	Tolerant of drought, frost and snow.
Flowers / Flowering Season	Flowers in spring and summer. White or pink flowers occurring in the leaf axils.
Foliage Colour or Type	The adult foliage is thick and leathery, blue-grey to olive-green, lanceolate to 16cm in length. Juvenile foliage is weeping and ovate.
Soil Type	Well-draining soil preferred. Can tolerate most soil types and pH levels.
Suited to	A beautiful tree for gardens or as a street tree.
