



Fraxinus angustifolia 'Raywood'

Claret Ash

A fast-growing tree with a rounded canopy. This tree grows up to 20 metres with dark green foliage that turns a burgundy through the autumn season.

Origin	North-Western Africa, South-Western Europe.
Size	Up to 20 metres high, Up to 12 metres wide.
Cultural Notes	Full sun is ideal for this tree. When being established, water deeply, though once established, will become drought tolerable. Prune young trees in late autumn to help establish central growth.
Tolerates	Tolerates most soils types, is drought tolerant when established.
Flowers / Flowering Season	Flowering is insignificant and often goes unnoticed. Flowers in spring.
Foliage Colour or Type	Glossy dark green leaves that are a narrow lance shape. Foliage turns a dark burgundy colour in autumn.
Soil Type	This tree will tolerate most soil types. Prefers neutral to alkaline soils that are well-draining, can tolerate acidic conditions.
Suited to	Parks and larger yard trees, creating good shade coverage in the summer.
