



# Quercus robur

## English Oak

A medium to large deciduous oak, this is a long-living, beautiful tree. This oak has a short trunk with ascending branches, dark grey bark and blue-green foliage which turns browns and reds through autumn.

Origin	Europe.
Size	Up to 11 metres high, Up to 11 metres wide.
Cultural Notes	Prefers full sun. When young, this tree can tolerate some shade. Water in well when planting and keep moist until tree establishes. This tree is low maintenance.
Tolerates	Tolerates drought once established.
Flowers / Flowering Season	Small, insignificant clusters of flowers known as catkins appear in spring, followed by acorns. This tree can take up to 20 years before yielding its first crop.
Foliage Colour or Type	Foliage is a beautiful blue-green colour with a 3-7 lobed shape. The leaves turn reds and browns in autumn before falling.
Soil Type	Well-draining, moist soil is preferred. Most soil types and pH levels can be tolerated.
Suited to	A perfect tree for parklands, larger gardens, and streetscapes.
